PRIMARY:

5th day before the primary if registering online or by mail.

By 12 p.m. on the last business day before the primary if registering in person.

GENERAL ELECTION:

14th day before the election if registering online or by mail.

By the 7th day before the election if registering in person.

If a Voter is registered with a party and, they want to change parties, they must do so 3 months prior to an election. If they are unaffiliated they can change to a party affiliation 7 days in person at registrar's office.

Connecticut now offers Election Day Registration. If you miss the registration deadline, you can register and vote in person on Election Day at the Government Center, 888 Washington Blvd, Stamford, CT.

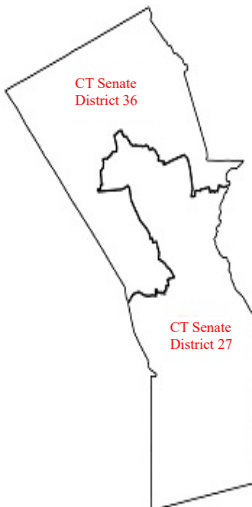

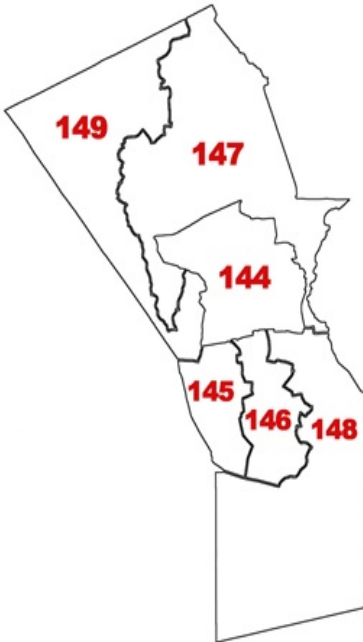

2020 Census

The United States Constitution Article 1, Section 2.. "Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States ... according to their respective Numbers ... The actual Enumeration shall be made within three Years after the first meeting of the Congress of the United States, and within every subsequent Term of ten Years." This is then combined with the 14th Amendment, Section 2:"Representatives shall be apportioned among the several States according to their respective numbers, counting the whole number of persons in each State..."

The U.S. Constitution mandates a count of persons every 10 years. The State of Connecticut and local governments receive funding from the Federal government based on the results of this Census. For every undercounted individual the State of Connecticut could lose \$2,930 which would impact the \$10 Billion in Federal funding the state receives annually. The Census also determines the number of districts and representatives Connecticut has in the House of Representatives. All residents should complete the Census even if they are not citizens. The Census will begin in mid- March 2020 – Census Day is April 1, 2020.
